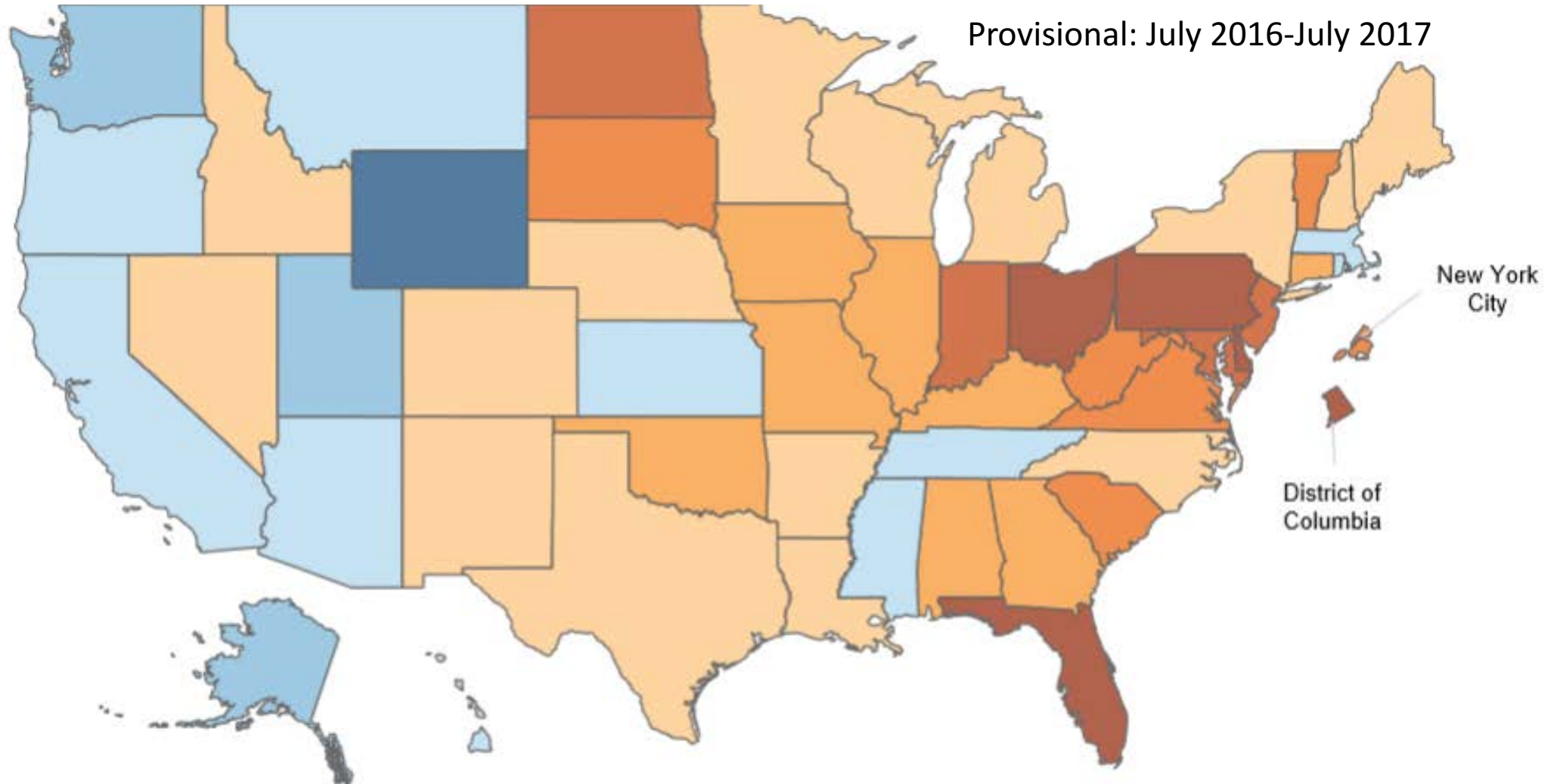
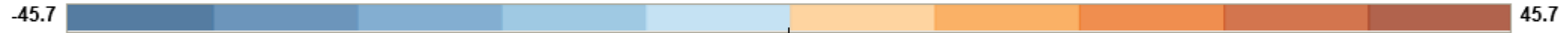

Legend for Percent Change in Drug Overdose Deaths Between 12-Month Ending Periods

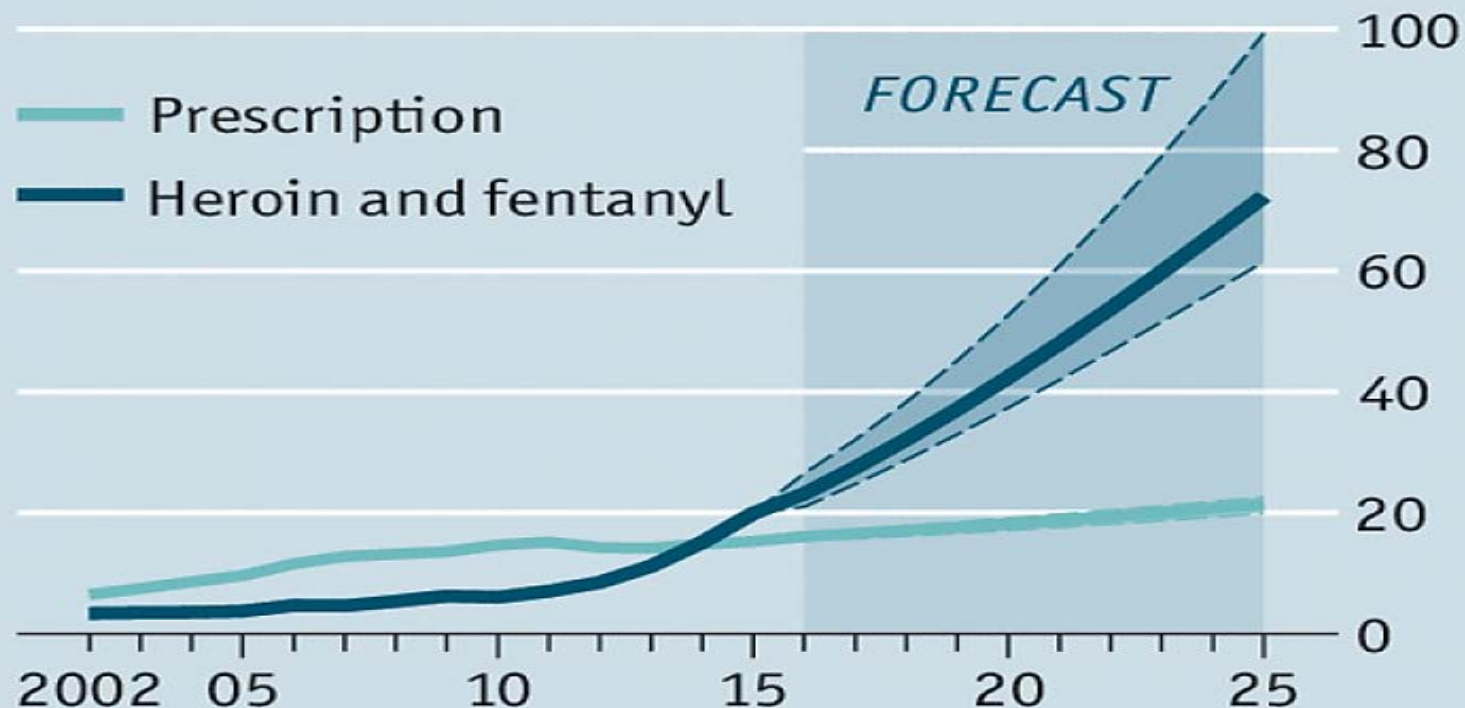

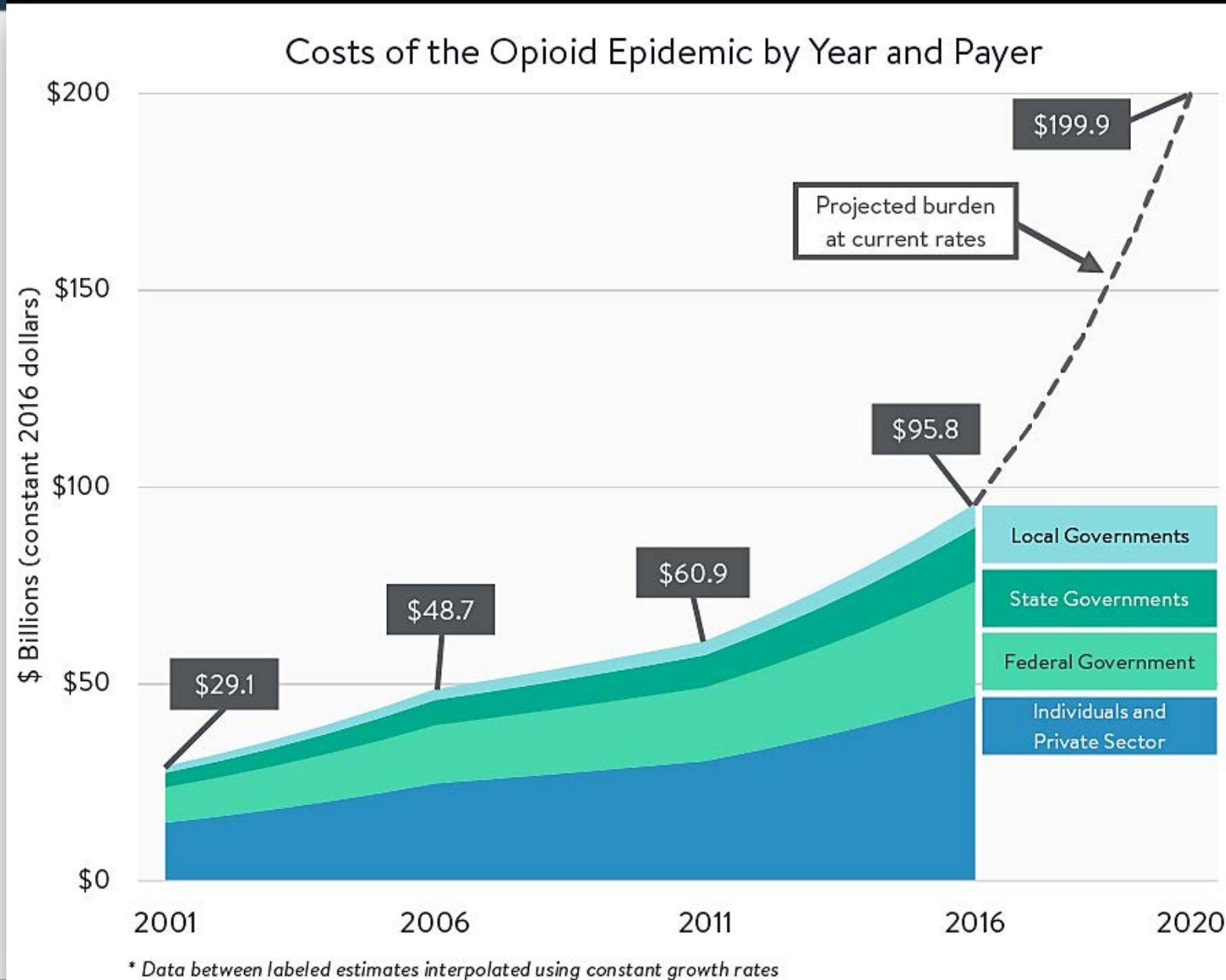
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United States, opioid-overdose deaths

# HHS Five-Point Opioid Strategy





# FY 2019 PROPOSED PRESIDENT'S BUDGET

- Opioid STR increases from \$500M to \$1B
- PPW increases from \$20 to \$40M
- Naloxone programs increase from \$25 to \$75M
- Drug Courts increase from \$60 to \$80M
- New Injection Drug/HIV Program: \$150M
- DFC included as new at \$100M
- MHBG is restored to \$562M
- Healthy Transitions restored to \$20M
- ACT increased from \$5 to \$15M
- MH CJ increased from \$4 to \$14M
- DAWN restored to \$15M

# Addressing the Crisis: Nuts & Bolts

- Support for evidence-based prevention, treatment, recovery services for opioid use disorder
  - STR grants to states -MAT-PDOA
  - Block grants to states -PPW
  - PCSS/ATTC/CIHS: TA to states/providers/other federal agencies (HRSA, IHS, DOJ) on EBP: MAT, psychotherapies, toxicology screens, pain management, PDMP use
  - Naloxone access/First Responders/Peers
  - Pregnant/post partum women/NAS
  - CJ programs with MAT
  - Recovery Coaches
  - HIPAA/42 CFR: Family inclusion in medical emergencies (e.g., overdose)
  - Public outreach: prevention
  - DAWN



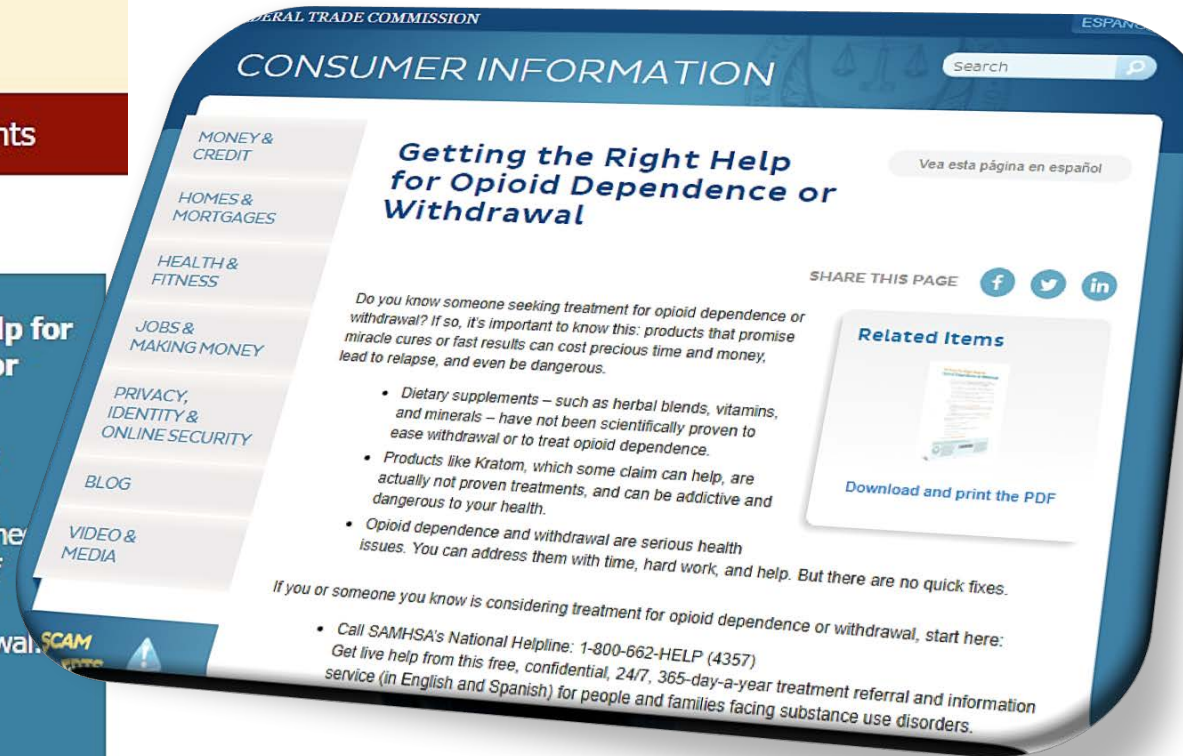

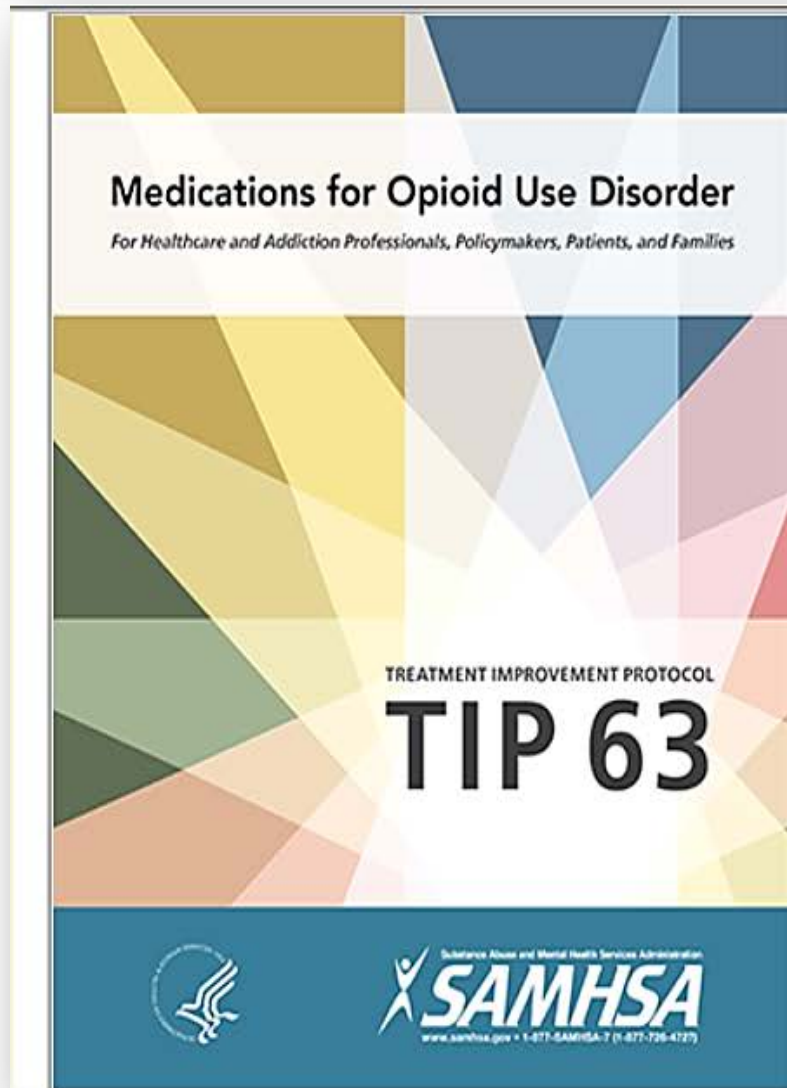

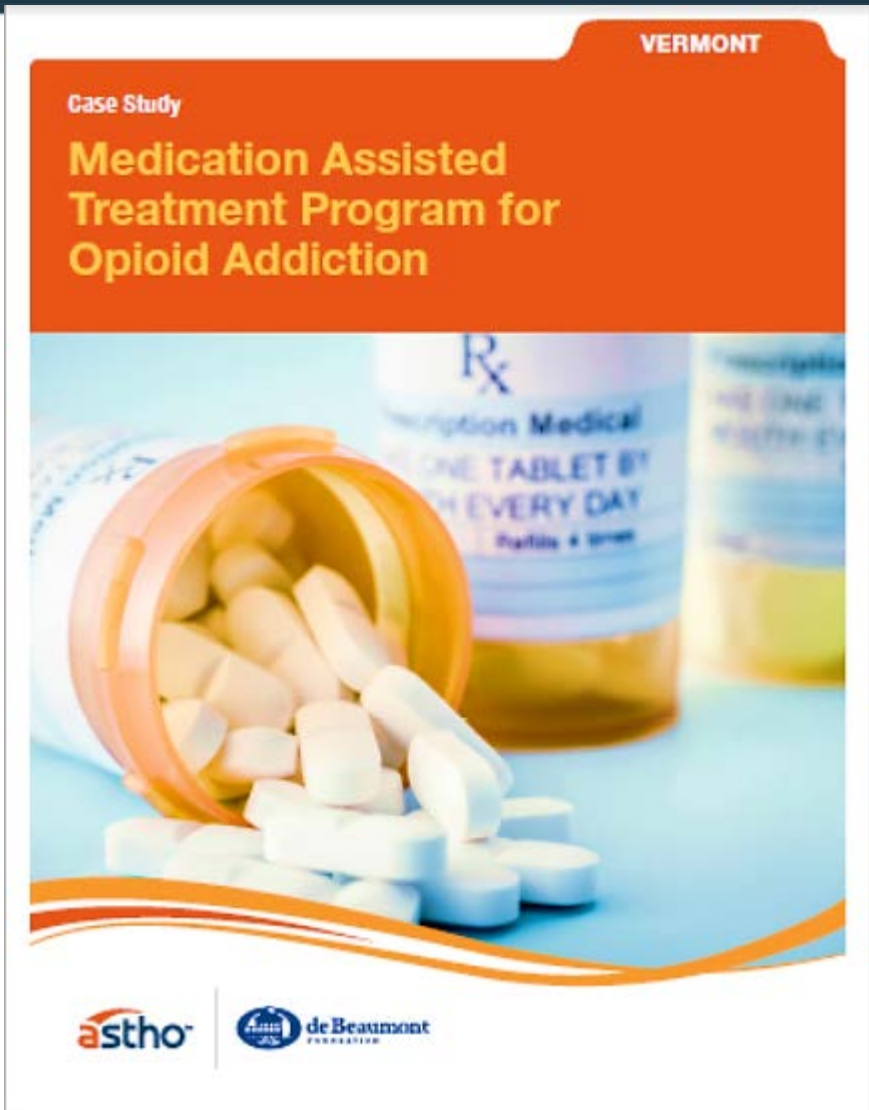
